Your service record should reflect service completed between October 1 until the following September 30. Turn in your completed service record on or before **October 15 (next fall)**, along with your Junior Livestock ambassador project summary. At the end of your term as Junior Livestock Ambassador you will be honored at 4-H Achievement Night based upon the following criteria:

- Bronze County Ambassador: 50-74 points earned
- Silver County Ambassador: 75-149 points earned
- Gold County Ambassador: 150 or more points earned

** Youth who fail to earn at least 50 points will not have fulfilled the minimum standards and will not be allowed to report their Junior Livestock Ambassador title in portfolio records, scholarship applications, etc.
