Any member, leader, parent, or community member is welcome to nominate a volunteer for an award. Awards criteria are listed below for each of the awards presented.

AWARD CRITERIA

SALUTE TO 4-H VOLUNTEER: Recognizes a volunteer who has provided outstanding service to 4-H. County recipient will be honored at the State 4-H Awards Banquet.

SALUTE TO 4-H YOUTH VOLUNTEERS: Recognizes a 4-H'er who was enrolled in 11th or 12th grade on January 1 of the current program year who has provided outstanding leadership and service to 4-H. county recipient will be honored at the State 4-H Awards Banquet.

4-H ALUMNI OF THE YEAR: Recognizes an alumnus who continues to live up to the 4-H motto, "Make the Best Better" by providing outstanding volunteer service to the 4-H program.

CLOVER KEY AWARD: The KEY to 4-H growth lies in new, committed, and creative leaders. This award recognizes new leaders with service from 1 to 5 years who have provided outstanding service to 4-H. County award recipient is nominated for the State Clover Key Award.

DOORKNOB AWARD: Recognizes a volunteer who has "opened the door" for the 4-H program through special outreach, marketing, or other efforts. County award recipient is nominated for the State Doorknob Award.

4-H FAMILY OF THE YEAR: Recognizes a family who has demonstrated outstanding involvement in and service to 4-H. County winner is nominated for the State 4-H Family of the Year Award.

FRIEND OF UTAH 4-H: This award is given to an individual or organization that has provided support and encouragement to 4-H. Recipient receives a special award and two tickets to the Leadermete awards banquet.

NEW LEADER AWARD: Recognizes an outstanding volunteer from 1 to 3 years who has made an impact in their club and community. The County recipient is nominated for the State New Leader Award. Recipient also receives ticket to Leadermete awards banquet.
