This year the 4-H office is offering monthly county-wide livestock group activities. These activities are a great opportunity for everyone to participate and learn various topics about the livestock project.


Show Pig Selection Clinic

The Show Pig Selection is a great clinic that will help out new families and answer some questions for

those who are looking for more information. Topics we will cover include: Breeds of Pigs, Selection Criteria, Nutrition/Medication, and Facilities/Pen Preparation. Also, we will be able to answer your questions and provide ideas on where to look for your future show pig.

Jr. Livestock Tests

Weber County 4-H members in grades 3-12 have the opportunity to compete in the 4-H Livestock Scholars testing program. To participate youth must be CURRENTLY enrolled in 4-H (and enrollment fees paid). 4-H members can take the test on any day the 4-H office is open (M-F, 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.) from the 15th through the end of the month. Once the month ends, members cannot take that month's test. The schedule for this year's tests can be found here.

- Awards are given for each species in each grade division.
- Each month's tests are prepared for all four species: beef, sheep, swine, and goats.
- Youth can select the test for the species they are studying. They do not have to be raising that species to participate in the test.
- The tests are a combination of true/false, multiple choice, and fill-in-the-blank.
- All the questions for the test come from the Ohio State University Resource manuals, which are available for purchase from the 4-H office.
