4-H Enrollment Fee Changes

Due to policy changes at the State 4-H level, the general 4-H fee will now be \$10 for members. Horse, Robotics, and Shooting Sports projects will now be \$20 for members. These changes went into effect on January 1, 2017.

Families can pay their 4-H fees online - look for an orange button that says "Add New Credit Card" on the payment screen. However, you can still call and pay by phone, or bring your payment to the 4-H office. Please remember that until you pay the enrollment fee, the enrollment status will remain "pending" which means enrollments are NOT active/current.

The link to 4-H Online and the instructions for online enrollment are on the Weber County 4-H webpage. Because you were enrolled in the 2015-16 4-H year, you already have a profile set up in 4-H Online. PLEASE DO NOT CREATE A NEW PROFILE! If you don't remember your password for 4-H Online select "I forgot my password" on the login screen, and a temporary one will be emailed to you. Jr. Livestock Tests

From October through July, Weber County 4-H members in grades 3-12 can compete in the Livestock Scholars testing program. To participate youth must be CURRENTLY enrolled in 4-H (and enrollment fees paid). 4-H members can take the test on any day the 4-H office is open (M-F, 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.) from the 15th through the end of the month. Once the month ends, members cannot take that month's test. The schedule for this year's tests can be found here.

- Awards are given for each species in each grade division.
- Each month's tests are prepared for all four species: beef, sheep, swine, and goats.
- Youth can select the test for the species they are studying. They do not have to be raising that species to participate in the test.
- The tests are a combination of true/false, multiple choice, and fill-in-the-blank.
- All the questions for the test come from the Ohio State University Resource manuals, which are available for purchase from the 4-H office.
