#### Fun & Leadership

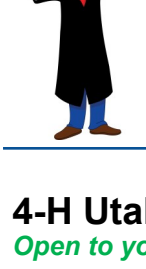

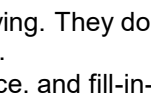
### Jr. Livestock Scholars Program

#### 2018-2019

Weber County 4-H members in 3rd - 12th grade have the opportunity to compete in the 4-H Livestock Scholars testing program. To participate, youth must be enrolled in 4-H (with enrollment fees paid). 4-H members can take the tests Monday - Friday from 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. from the 5th through the end of the month. Once the month ends, members cannot take that month's test.

The test schedule for the upcoming 4-H year is updated and posted on the [4-H website](#).

- Awards are given for each species in each grade division.
- Each month's tests are prepared for all four species: beef, goat, sheep, and swine.
- Youth can select the test for the species they are studying. They do not have to be raising that species to participate in the test.
- The tests are a combination of true/false, multiple choice, and fill-in-the-blank.
- All the questions for the test come from the Ohio State University Resource manuals, which are available for purchase from the 4-H office.

Grades 6-12, compete individually or in teams of two (youth must be currently enrolled in 4-H to participate). Contest Overview: Make a healthy meal and clean up within one hour. Contestants need to provide all their ingredients, cooking equipment, etc. Stove, microwave, and oven provided.

**Registration Deadline: January 22** (no exceptions). Limited space; reserve your spot by turning in a completed "Menu, Information & Recipe Form" and indicate preferred session. Register online through Contest Registration on the Weber County 4-H web-page (contest forms can also be uploaded using the contest registration page).

**CHEF EXTRAORDINAIRE:** Tuesday, January 29, 4:00-7:00 p.m. at Wahlquist Junior High (2656 N. 2400 W., Farr West). Grades 6-12, compete individually or in teams of two (youth must be currently enrolled in 4-H in order to participate). Contest Overview: Make and serve a complete meal to four guests (plus one judge) and clean up within a three hour time limit. You provide your own guests (what a nice treat for your family). Contestants need to provide all their own ingredients, place settings, tablecloth, utensils, table decorations, cooking equipment, etc. Stove, microwave, and oven provided.
