Jr. Livestock Activities


This year the 4-H office is offering monthly county-wide livestock group activities. These activities are a great opportunity for everyone to participate and learn various topics about the livestock project.

Jr. Livestock Tests

Weber County 4-H members in grades 3-12 have the opportunity to compete in the 4-H Livestock Scholars testing program. To participate youth must be CURRENTLY enrolled in 4-H (and enrollment fees paid). 4-H members can take the test on any day the 4-H office is open (M-F, 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.) from the 15th through the end of the month. Once the month ends, members cannot take that month's test. The schedule for this year's tests can be found here.

- Awards are given for each species in each grade division.
- Each month's tests are prepared for all four species: beef, sheep, swine, and goats.
- Youth can select the test for the species they are studying. They do not have to be raising that species to participate in the test.
- The tests are a combination of true/false, multiple choice, and fill-in-the-blank.
- All the questions for the test come from the Ohio State University Resource manuals, which are available for purchase from the 4-H office.

The 4-H State Officer application is NOW OPEN. This is a great leadership opportunity for youth currently in 10th & 11th grades on a state level! Applications are submitted through <u>4-H Online</u>. The deadline to apply is June 23rd.

What is a 4-H State Officer?

A 4-H State Officer is an individual who has been elected by the 4-H youth body to represent Utah 4-H. State Officers are responsible for shaping the future of 4-H. Officers will be charged with presenting on their specific areas, teaching about the 4-H mission mandates. Their goal will be delivering virtual trainings throughout the state via pre-recorded and live social media platforms. The Officers will each create and deliver two Mission Mandate video trainings per quarter. They will also be charged with creating tracks for the Utah 4-H State Contests.
