It's Time to Re-enroll!

2018-2019 4-H Year Began October 1st

The new 4-H year began October 1st which means it's time for members and leaders to re-enroll in [4-H Online](#) (Leaders and members must complete enrollment **EACH** year).

Enrollment instructions and link can be found [here](#). Families can pay the \$10 enrollment fee online with credit or debit card. However, project fees (horse, shooting sports, Cloverbuds, robotics, sewing, and community club) cannot be paid online at this time. Project fees can be paid in office or by phone by calling **801-399-8202**. Member enrollments will remain "**pending**" until all fees have been paid.

As a reminder, **PLEASE DO NOT CREATE A NEW PROFILE** if you or your family were enrolled in 4-H previously. Your family profile will already be setup on 4-H Online. If you are unable to remember your [4-H Online](#) password, please select "I forgot my password" then a temporary password will be emailed to you.

It is best to complete the 4-H enrollment early so you won't miss out on important dates and activity information. ***Members and leaders must **enroll by 12/31/18** to continue to receive newsletters and notifications.

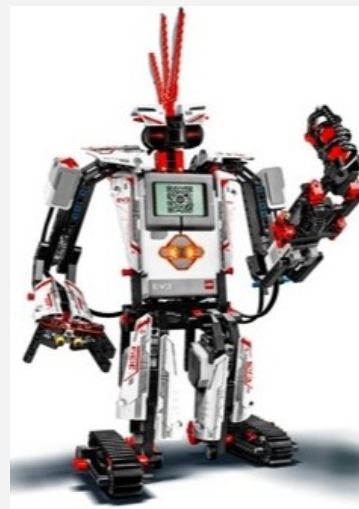

Jr. Livestock Scholars Program

2018-2019

Weber County 4-H members in 3rd - 12th grade have the opportunity to compete in the 4-H Livestock Scholars testing program. To participate, youth must be enrolled in 4-H (with enrollment fees paid). 4-H members can take the tests **Monday - Friday from 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.** from the **5th through the end of the month.** Once the month ends, members cannot take that month's test.

The test schedule for the upcoming 4-H year is updated and posted on the [4-H website](#).

- Awards are given for each species in each grade division.
- Each month's tests are prepared for all four species: beef, goat, sheep, and swine.
- Youth can select the test for the species they are studying. They do not have to be raising that species to participate in the test.
- The tests are a combination of true/false, multiple choice, and fill-in-the-blank.
- All the questions for the test come from the Ohio State University Resource manuals, which are available for purchase from the 4-H office.
